Welcome to the inaugural International Homeopathy Research Conference, hosted by The Homeopathy Research Institute (HRI). At this landmark event we will be bringing together both active researchers, practitioners, students and those with an interest in homeopathy research, to hear from world experts about their latest findings and what they see for the future of this rapidly developing field.

Conference Overview

Interest in homeopathy research has grown dramatically over recent years, both within the homeopathic profession and externally. This reflects the ever-increasing emphasis being placed on evidence based medicine across all modalities and the crucial role rigorous research is now playing in the development of homeopathy.

The HRI's inaugural conference, with its theme of *Cutting Edge Research* in Homeopathy, is a rare event in the worldwide conference calendar. On most occasions research sessions are embedded within events covering homeopathy as a whole or homeopathy-related sessions are only one element covered within a CAM-wide research event. The HRI is proud to be hosting a two and a half day event dedicated solely to homeopathy research, providing a unique forum for the sharing of ideas and the creation of international scientific collaborations.

Conference objectives

In order to encourage and promote progression within this field, it is helpful to look at what we know now and what we are close to learning.
